He then went into the mercantile business for himself and in 1881 moved to Charleston. In Malden he was active in the Presbyterian Church. He once served as Kanawha County sheriff. The purpose of the "Remarks" column of this document is unclear, but presumably Hubbard was the person who reported the wedding to the county officials.
