I think that you will find that the injury done to our two horses is due to the want of system in feeding of the horses. To have two of the most valuable horses injured in this way is a very great financial loss to the school.

Mr. Chambliss³ complains that sand is not supplied regularly at the brick-yard nor mud ground. Please report to me what is necessary in order to remedy this trouble. How much more team is necessary?

In regard to the feed of the stock we have gone to the expense of getting a cutter, but the Superintendent of Industries reports that this cutter is seldom used. It is impossible for me to spend more time in taking up your department in the way that I have, and I ask you most earnestly to make a change in regard to your work.
