- 1890 May 3: Margaret James Murray appointed Lady Principal of Tuskegee Institute.  
Aug. 14: Publication of criticism of Negro clergy.
- 1892 Feb. 23: First Tuskegee Negro Conference.  
May 26: Frederick Douglass speaks at Tuskegee's commencement.  
Oct. 12: Marriage to Margaret James Murray.
- 1893 Jan. 11: Opening of Phelps Hall Bible School.  
Feb. 18: Samuel Chapman Armstrong visits Tuskegee Institute.  
May 11: Death of Samuel Chapman Armstrong.  
Nov. 15: Speech before the Christian Workers' Convention, Atlanta, Ga.  
November: Criticism of Bishop Henry M. Turner and the idea of black emigration.
