VOLUME 4, p. 433, Judge George W. Kelley was a white man, originally of South Braintree, Mass. He moved to Rockland, Mass., in 1896, where he lived until his death in 1926. Beginning in 1883, he was justice of the second district of Plymouth. He was chairman of the board of trustees of the Voorhees Normal and Industrial School for many years.

VOLUME 8, p. 145, the endnote of the Article on Black Labor in the South should read: "PD Con. 956 BTW Papers DLC." The version that appeared in the *Atlanta Constitution*, Nov. 27, 1904, 9, had another headline and varied slightly from the pamphlet version in capitalization and punctuation.
